Predominantly flat terrain with elevations gradually dropping off to the north towards Henderson Inlet and east towards the Nisqually River Valley.

b. What is the steepest slope on the site (approximate percent slope)? [help] While terrain is predominantly flat with gradual elevation changes, some localized areas can exceed 35% in slope.

Soils are predominantly gravelly sandy loam with other categories in localized areas. No agricultural lands of long-term commercial significance currently exist.

While primarily located outside the incorporated boundaries of the City of Lacey, a history of slides exists to the east along the Nisqually River bluff and north along the Puget Sound.
